#### **Recognition for Hector Peterson School**

SSASF applicants have always come from the Hector Peterson Secondary School in Wallacedene, a fast-growing district of Cape Town that has historically seen high rates of poverty and crime. Despite these environmental challenges, Principal Mike Mavovana and the Hector Peterson School have received recognition for some incredible accomplishments:

"The school achieved remarkable success with a 92.6% pass rate [for final matric exams], a whopping 14.1 percentage point increase from last year. Moreover, 55% of their candidates achieved bachelor's passes [equivalent to "passed with honors" - Ed.] – up from 40.2% last year. And they did this all, while increasing the number of candidates writing from 204 to 229."

Here is Caroline on her experience with SSASF:

"My name is Caroline, and I am one of the student leaders of SSASF. This is my second year running SSASF, and it has been such a positive and eye-opening experience. One of my favorite parts of running SSASF is the application process. This is very difficult because we are only able to offer one or two scholarships, but we receive 10-12 applications from hard-working and deserving students.

Knowing the future of someone's education lies in your hands can be stressful, but it also means we are very dedicated to finding who we believe will represent SSASF and who possesses our values. One central idea of SSASF is being able to return and give back to their community in Cape Town so that is an essential part while reading the applications and explaining them to our members. This year, in particular, SSASF received many genuine applications from students with excellent grades. Therefore, it truly came down to the essays portion of the application to help pick a scholar.

This process was eye-opening as some of the applicants talked about their living situations and the difficulties they face while trying to receive their education. This resonated with me and changed my perspective on my own education. I believe it is crucial for students to view education as a gift, not a requirement. Being able to help someone further their education is truly a privilege and that is why I am very thankful to be a part of SSASF and be part of the application process."
